SCRIPTURE READINGS

PSALM 23.5-6a

You prepare a Table before me in the presence of my enemies, you anoint my head with oil, my cup overflows Surely your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life.

Thanks for the invitation to share a message with you. I am using one of Jesus' parables. It is both a warning and a promise, but above all it is full of wisdom, both earthly and divine. The parable of the weeds.

• MATTHEW 13: 24—30:

Jesus told them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field. **But while everyone was sleeping**, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and went away. When the wheat sprouted and formed heads, then the weeds also appeared. The owner's servants came to him and said 'Sir didn't you sow good seed in your field? Where then did the weeds come from?'

[&]quot;'No' he answered, 'because while you are pulling up the weeds, you may uproot the wheat with them. Let both grow together until the harvest. At that time I will tell the harvesters: First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles to be burned; then gather the wheat and bring it into my barn.'"



[&]quot;'An enemy did this', he replied.

[&]quot;The servants asked him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?'

A nurse in a London hospital is told she is no longer welcome at work because she wears a cross. A police officer is told the same. A Christian hospital in Australia is told to cease business because it will not perform abortions. (Calvary hospital, Canberra). In the U.S. a father of 7 and his wife are vilified for praying in public near an abortion clinic. It is illegal in Australia to pray with a person about their sexual orientation (even at their request!)........

Are these and other anti-Christian measures the "weeds" of our time?

I think they are. What does our Lord say about such things?

This parable, but not only **this** parable, (see also John 10:13) – false prophets—warnings and promises.

Jesus, in my understanding is saying to us, be alert, be ready, be circumspect. Know your master, know His call. Be prepared for the kingdom (the barn) speaks to situations which Australian Christians increasingly experience in everyday life. It has been said that the Christian faith is the most persecuted religious group in the Western ('Christian'?) world.

Jesus' parable gives us powerful guidance in our world.

- 1. If you can recognise evil, keep watch over it (no sleeping)
- 2. There will be a time to act, and then
- 3. Act decisively.

In the meantime how will God sustain us? David's Psalm 23 tells us that God will lord it over unbelievers by uplifting us in their presence. But we are not meant to be idle.

1 Peter 3:14—16: "but even if you should suffer for what is right, you are blessed...... always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect."

It has been estimated that within 30 years there may be more mosques in Germany than churches, and, in that other bastion of protestant Christianity, the U.K., a Daily Telegraph headline stated that quite soon "the flag of Islam could fly over Downing street". Not quite, but there is a Hindu prime minister in residence. Not far behind is the U.S.A., and Australia.

Yet the words of Jesus do not advocate paralysis, or panic. We are called to be alert, to remain faithful, and be ready to pull the "weeds" at the right time. Throughout his ministry Jesus was caring, compassionate,..... and, yes streetwise. From his outrage at the temple, to his "calling out" of the pharisees, he rose to the occasion where he saw the weeds of his time. The same Jesus' message to us is from John 16, following his warnings and his own fateful prediction, in verse 33 " I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble, but take heart! I have overcome the world".



SHALL WE PRAY:

Lord God, be with us in the days of trial and trouble. Lord we find it difficult to be optimistic about our faith at times. But draw us near, Father, and renew our faith even in the midst of turmoil. Turn us to the words of your son, and His kingdom promise.

In His name we pray. Amen
