Scripture:

Message: Jesus loves faith: Trust Jesus and you won't go wrong!

What pleases God? It's very clear isn't it? So simple a young child knows instinctively. It is faith, trust, and confident reliance on our God and on our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Holy Spirit summed it up inspiring the Epistle writer with the words: And it is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to him must believe that God exists and that he rewards those who sincerely seek him.¹

Faith gets the believer close to God. It stirs deeds, faith deeds. Faith works itself into the human soul, into your soul. What you believe is what you become. This attribute is one of three things which we can carry into the life beyond the grave². Faith runs with personal relationship, indeed the deeper the love-relationship the more the trust.

Jesus was excited when he saw faith happening. The non-Jew who sought out Jesus to heal his servant and the Canaanite woman, desperate for her possessed daughter; Jesus glowed with wonder at their faith declaring it 'great faith'. The Apostle was also thrilled at how the new converts in Corinth and Thessalonica were expanding in faith deeds.

Faith of course is endemic to all life, especially in human innovation and expansion. Some say science deals with facts and religion with faith. That isn't even half true. Scientific endeavour is always using faith, every experiment relies on hitherto understood data and constancies to dig further into areas of reality. Some religion deals with ethereal things but true Christianity, faith in God with much more. Like scientific endeavour it involves trusting that which can be interacted with and known.

Some research shows that Faith or Trust is part of a healthy life and a cause of longevity; the stronger faith is, the longer a person will live. It's a life force.

Jesus seemed to evaluate all his interactions in terms of the faith that was present. If there was no faith he blasted it as 'wicked, adulterous and unbelieving'. Several times the disciples earned a low-grade commendation as of 'little faith'. But the big faith of a few made his day! He emphasized that even tiny (mustard seed size) faith was momentous.

The episode with the Canaanite woman probably more than any other shows how Jesus loved and searched for faith from his countrymen and others who knew something about him.

This woman had heard of or perhaps even seen him. Although she was part of a broken and depraved culture she recognised royalty. "Lord, Son of David" she cried, "have mercy on me! My daughter is suffering terribly from demon possession."

Jesus ignored her, and the disciples thinking Jesus was bothered by her sought to be rid of her. But she persisted and kept worrying with her concern. Jesus turns her down. "I was only sent to the lost sheep of Israel". You don't qualify! But she knew he had it and she desperately wanted his power to help. She falls before him pleading over and over "Lord, help me".

How many blessings are lost to believers who fail to press into the Lord's heart like this woman? She bound her pleas to his mercy. And Jesus let her do it to him.

Then came the crushing cold reason of Jesus: "It is not right to take the children's bread and toss it to their dogs".

Is this the end for her? Does she still hold faith in the grace of this Man? Yes, woman, you are just a dog, the best you can do is wait for the true children to be served. No rights to Israel's blessings, no key to the wonders of the Messiah!

Not enough to quell her desperation! Her feverish raw belief that this Lord of Israel had something for her too. And she will not quiet till it is hers! And with one immortal sentence, she lunges into the eternal truth of mercy and compassion in the heart of this Son of David who is in in truth the world's only Saviour!



So Jesus teaches all followers to yield to nothing but the reality of His saving, helping powerful grace. Adequate for all our situations of life, death and on into the eternal! We honour him by taking His Word, believing his character and living riotously, abundantly by faith!

Prayer:

Dear Father, you have told us that Jesus is your beloved Son and we must listen to Him. We should honour Him with our trust above and before all other beings, institutions and powers. Dear Lord, we cling to you as the Canaanite woman of old; burn away our disbelief, and cause us to be blessed as those who, not seeing, yet believe. Lord Jesus take me on into a world of faith in Jesus knowing the life which is Life indeed.
