Summary

Or what woman, having ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp and sweep the house and seek diligently until she finds it? And when she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin which was lost". Just so, I tell you, there is joy before the angels of God over one sinner who repents.

MESSAGE:

There is no hiding in Jesus - it seems he is always out there, showing up, engaging with people, sharing, teaching, learning, interacting. He is with sinners, and all manner of society. So while the Pharisees and scribes were busy tut-tutting his activities, he is where he is most needed — He is with lovers of money, lovers of self, people with low morals. Is this a place for the Messiah to be? Not according to the leaders of the day! When Jesus heard their opinion he told the parable of the lost sheep and also of the prodigal son. Clearly Jesus knew where he needed to be, not comfy, not convenient (the woman at the well in Samaria), not always pleasant (Lazarus), not always agreeable (Luke 19:45 a messy temple), no matter where he went, or who he met, there were issues.

Even in the Temple there was no hiding, no cringing in the corner. Show up, speak out.

Luke 19:10 "for the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."

Have any of us been to such places? Where it is OK for us to be—or show up, as it were? A new Christian asked me to have morning tea with a country road work gang. I was a bit nervous about this, but went along when they had morning smoko. My friend introduced me to his workmates, and some challenging questions followed. I can recall the dozer driver had some colourful points to make. But overall it was a worthwhile time for us all.

I won't pretend it was a comfy experience, but would Jesus turn up there, I asked myself?

Acts 1:8-9 "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and Samaria, and to the end of the earth. Following this Jesus was lifted up and went from their sight." So, according to Acts, these were was his final earthly messages to his followers. Yes there are two. Firstly v.6-7 "Will you now restore the Kingdom?" The reply "It is not for you to know times or seasons the Father has fixed by his own authority" and secondly, v.8 "But you shall receive power......and you shall be my witnesses" I.E. show up. I'm often surprised when some Christians try again and again to predict when our Lord will come again. I think the message is clear—it's not our concern, for us it is to believe, and live out our faith, and be prepared (See Matt 25:1—10).

That means showing up and being prepared to be witnesses. Which means:

- A witness has to speak the truth.
- A witness speaks without fear or favour.
- A witness shares an experience to the best of their ability.

We are encouraged in all this by our Lord's reassurance as recorded in John 14: 1-5.

PRAYERS FOR OTHERS

Heavenly Father, we ask your presence now with those in need, be it physical, emotional or spiritual. There are many struggling, Lord, not knowing where to turn. Hear their cry and draw near to them. May your peace be felt in the hour of need, Lord, as the time of most trouble arrives. Thank you that you are always ready to support, encourage, and deliver. And we give
