And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ – to the glory and praise of God.

## Message: "Tent or Skyscraper?"

Recently at our church we celebrated the baptism of a young lad of 10. Mainly through his parents he is steeped in the Scriptures and it was his desire and decision to be baptised. He wanted to declare his faith and the foundation he had in the saving grace of Jesus. The message that followed contained a quote from Howard Hendricks – "You don't build a tent on the foundations of a skyscraper".

That which we celebrate in a baptism is a foundation for our lives that is eternal, indestructible, and not of our own construction. Yes, it is our decision to follow Jesus, to confess the sin which has separated us from the Father, but the entire work of reconciliation is that of Jesus on the cross. So, the foundation, fit for a skyscraper, is laid. And what happens next? We build!

The Bible has a lot of imagery of building. There is the well-known parable of building on the rock and not on the sand. There is the picture in 1 Corinthians 3 of building on the foundation which can be nothing other than Jesus, but what is built can vary. It can be a flimsy "tent" which doesn't fare well in the fire of judgement, or it can be a "skyscraper" which survives. It is a testimony to the power of Jesus salvation that even if we have built "rubbish" in our lives, we are still saved (1 Cor 3:15).

Another quote, this time from CS Lewis, indicates what choices we should be making about what we build to fulfil God's plan for each of us, recognising that these choices are not always easy, and in fact may even be painful – "Imagine yourself as a living house. God comes in to rebuild that house. At first perhaps you can understand what he is doing. He is getting the drains right and stopping the leaks in the roof and so on...... But presently he starts knocking the house about in a way that hurts abominably and does not seem to make sense. What on earth is he up to? The explanation is that he is building quite a different house from the one you thought of – throwing out a new wing here, putting on an extra floor there, running up towers, making courtyards. You thought you were going to be made into a decent little cottage: but he is building a palace. He plans to come and live in it himself!"

So, we are at the threshold of 2023 with perhaps talk of New Year's Resolutions. I'm not sure if you have a good record with NYRs, but most of us don't. Perhaps those unwanted kilos remain stubbornly attached to our waistlines! But the worthiest NYR (or for that matter Any Day of the Year Resolution) is to build on what Jesus has done in our lives, maybe recently, or maybe decades ago. Resolve to turn some of those tents into skyscrapers.

The book of Philippians, of which the introduction is above, I reckon could be called a builder's handbook or manual as it contains advice about what needs to happen, or change, in our lives. In reading through Philippians (don't forget to do it!), here are a few tips for your (and my) building sites. As you read it through, others may strike you.

• Phil 1:9-11 ...... that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth ......

Paul is talking about is growth in righteousness, that is, our behaviour, our thinking, all aspects of our lives becoming right and pleasing in God's



eyes – so much so that God will be delighted with what he sees in us when Jesus comes again.

**How to** When faced with behavioural choices, draw from your growing knowledge and wisdom, and perhaps ask that question, WWJD (What Would Jesus Do?). And remember, the Holy Spirit lives in us to guide, strengthen, and <u>not</u> lead us into temptation (Lord's Prayer).

- Phil 1:27-28 ... conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel ...... Stand firm ... without being frightened in any way by those who oppose you. We all suffer fear at times of what may happen if we speak up, tell others of our faith in God, or even speak up on behalf of others. We are afraid of what others may think, afraid that we may not be articulate enough. Paul wrote this in a Roman prison, facing death, as do many of our brothers and sisters in other countries.
  How to By a step of faith, just do it! And remember the Holy Spirit lives in us. Cling to the promise that "blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness" (Matt 5:10). Rely on others as we "strive together as one" (v27).
- Phil 2:5 In your relationships with others have the same mindset as Jesus. The well-known passage that follows explains the humility of Jesus as he gave up his place next to the Father, made himself nothing, humbled himself by being obedient even to death – for you and me. Self-sacrificing humility does not come easily – our ego, our social standing, our self-image are hard to give up, particularly in relation to some people!

**How to** Don't think highly of yourself. Act towards others as though they are important, don't look to take credit, deliberately do something for someone else. And remember the Holy Spirit lives in you, reminding you that Christ is sufficient for you, and exalts us just as Jesus was exalted for his humility (2:9)

• Phil 4:2 I plead with Euodia and I plead with Syntiche to be of the same mind in the Lord.

That means restoring relationships in the Body of Christ with those with whom we have fallen out. Unity in the church is crucial for the witness of the saving grace of Jesus. (John 17:21)

**How to** Don't wait, make the first move. Do all you can to live peaceably with each other (Romans 12:18)

• Phil 4:8 Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things.

All our observable actions take place in our heads and hearts first. Our sinful natures pop up and we sometimes succumb to them.

**How to** In the Garden of Eden God gave Adam and Eve the freedom to choose. We still have it! We can choose to "think about these things" and we can choose not to think about the other stuff. And remember, the Holy Spirit lives in us, strengthening us, making each subsequent decision easier to make as we continue to attain the likeness of Jesus. And praise God for his abundant forgiveness for every time we trip up.



 Phil 4:4,6,12 Rejoice in the Lord always ..... Do not be anxious about anything ..... I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation. That is, practise radical living. These admonitions turn the logic of the world on its head. Who in their right mind rejoices always, is not anxious about anything, is always content regardless of circumstances?

**How to** Try it even when you don't feel like it. And remember the Holy Spirit lives in you, producing his fruits of love, joy, peace, patience ... and the other 5!

How's that for some New Year's Resolutions? And you are not on your own. Repeat this promise to yourself ...... I can do all this through him who strengthens me (4:13). Even if we only have a tent on the foundations so far, God wants us to be building that skyscraper, that mansion. It has eternal implications. NYRs test your resolve. This tests your faith.
