Theme:

Three things we need to know about falling in love and marriage which have benefit for all relationships. Key truths for ourselves, our loved ones and others with whom we may have relevant conversation

Acknowledgement: (If used for public worship)

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<u>Message</u>

There are three things you won't hear about marriage today that are essential for a good and ever-improving marriage. Our prevailing 'me-first' culture doesn't like commitment or the hard yards required for building solid, lasting relationships. Pledged vows are replaced with pleasure sentiments. Some couples prefer to make pre-nuptial legal agreements lest the marriage fails.

But for those who hope for rich and deepening marriages into their golden years there are three great truths to embrace and pursue in practice. Some will know these but perhaps you can pass them on to those younger ones you care for who might listen and receive your counsel.

Here they are:

1. Get things in the right order.

Start making a nest first. Observe the birds, they make a nest then lay their eggs! Signal your seriousness to the one you are attracted to then put your emotions on ice somewhat



until the preconditions are in place. That season is called engagement or betrothal in earlier times. Then marry.

When I first approached my father-in-law-to-be and asked for his daughter's hand in marriage, he basically said 'no'. I had no sound employment, no house, basically pretty much nothing just raw emotion. I kind of knew the answer and had to knuckle down to get things sorted before I could take on the responsibilities required.

To those falling in love, let me say, don't just start living together in intimacy. Worse, don't do that just to 'see how things work out', a kind of having it all in a trial period before you are committed to a lifelong partnership. Couples who do that have a far decreased likelihood of a successful marriage. Or if you do elope, as it is actually called, consider yourself fully married regardless of a marriage service.

Sexual intimacy seals lifelong marriage. Look at the problems if this isn't adhered to. As an aside here, I support the idea of young men who make a girl pregnant being legally and financially bound to support her and the child rather than leaving it all to her and walking away to another encounter as often happens these days with our sickly diminished sense of human responsibility.

2. Marriage is for the improvement of your character.

We learn best where we are loved most. Where we can most be honest and transparent. Where we can be rebuked without the relationship ending. Seeing fault is a doorway into a deeper love. Marriage is a superior love-bonded relationship where this can happen. A wonderful sacred gift from our Creator.

The pattern of love Christ requires us to follow by His grace is such that when we are irked or see fault in our beloved, rather than rejection we must more deeply receive and love them. Read again those verses in Ephesians chapter five, verses twenty-five to twentyseven. This is also standard behaviour for life in the Body of Christ which is the image of the marriage relationship.

A married woman recently shared this with me "Marriage is an incredible ground for mutual growth! Is your marriage growing you? If not, there is more potential waiting to be tapped! Are you ready to harness this potential?"

3. Realise that a man loves in a certain way. And a woman loves in a certain way.

If both are nourished nothing will separate you. A husband cherishes his wife, a wife honours her husband. Of course, there is overlap but these are the most basic motivational ways of expressing love in marriage.

If a wife knows that her husband who works all day in an environment of pretty secretaries who do their best to turn up every day looking and smelling the best they can, if she knows she is cherished above all women by her husband she will rest, assured of and in his faithfulness.

Likewise, if he knows that in her eyes and heart, he is honoured, respected and admired by his wife, the one who knows him best and loves him most, he will walk with a straight back



and head uplifted in spite of flack and criticism he may receive at work or elsewhere.

That's how it is. And these ways and attitudes cannot be forced or manipulated, they can only be given, endowed from hearts and wills of genuine love.

This is how Christ loves even us. He cherishes us, talks of us with pride, seeks our best and remains faithful in his promises to us.

Dear Father, your Son walked obediently to death even upon a cross to save us and bring us every day into abundant life. Thank you for this great unfailing, cherishing love. We love you and will honour you every day in gratitude. Help us to serve you unfailingly, in Jesus Name.
