Summary

Solid foundations, both physical and spiritual, are crucial. John's epistle emphasizes love, truth, and staying true to doctrine amid false teachings. Paul's letter to Titus highlights foundational belief and belonging in faith.

• 1 JOHN 4:17-21

In this is love perfected with us, that we may have confidence for the day of judgement, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and he who fears is not perfected in love. We love, because he first loved us. If any one says I love God, and hates his brother, he is a liar: for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen. MESSAGE "A solid Foundation"

Back in the 90's I purchased an above ground swimming pool Quite large, and decided to sink it half into the ground, where I would assemble the thing. After making the hole, I commenced assembly (with family help) but first there had to be a good base for the main support posts. They would ensure the whole mass (37500 litres of water) would stand-up long term. So we found some cement slab pavers, and used them to place on our sandy West Lakes soil. They needed to be put on compacted soil then hammered into place. That was the foundation, and it held for many years, even with a pool full of kids and water sloshing from side to side.

Solid foundations are needed for many structures in our world, both physical and spiritual.

John's first letter was written in Greek around 85, from Ephesus, to unspecified congregations with central themes of love and encouragement. Persecution and false teaching were rife. At the time, and now! The epistle smacks you in the face with its straight to the mark frankness and proclamation of truth (Ch 1:1-4). Stay true to good doctrine, in a style unique to John with a message for us all – a solid foundation. Paul emphasises this too in his letter to the Roman church. The central theme of 1 John is to love one another, his main points being:

Love one another!

- God gives new life
- How would God have us live
- No fence sitting!
- Have you experienced the transforming love in Jesus?
- Chap 1:9 an atoning sacrifice
- Stronger together 1:7

John sets a high standard for early Christian churches in loving one another through the sacrifice of Jesus – John was a witness to that horrific time. But don't waste that love that was brought to them, and now us, then and always.

John also reminds us about impure spirits and the antichrist. "Jesus Christ has come in the flesh" (4:1) an in-the-face reminder of truth and maybe a response to emerging views (Gnostic and docetistic) which were questioning the reality of Jesus' humanity.

John's challenge to the Church is that it must remind all about Jesus Christ's all atoning sacrifice – a very high benchmark, but one which John insists upon, in all believers. That means, we need to know who we are, and to whom we belong e.g Titus 1:1-4 "I Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, to further the faith of God's elect and their knowledge of the truth which accords with Godliness, in hope of eternal life with God, who never dies, promised ages ago and at the proper time manifested in his word through the preaching with which I have been entrusted by command of God our saviour. To Titus, my true CHILD in the common faith". In this opening of Paul's letter to Titus you can clearly identify foundational belief AND belonging, both keys to evangelical ministry. In my experience there are times when belonging comes first, that is relational evangelism.
